

Florida College Missouri Summer Camp
Rules & Conduct

- Campers are required to stay in their cabins after the evening events. Leaving a cabin without permission at night will result in being sent home.
- No fireworks, alcohol, tobacco (chewing or smoking), or unprescribed medication.
- Campers are expected to bring their Bibles to the morning and evening devotionals. They are also expected to take their provided class material with their Bible to Bible class.
- Campers are not allowed in cabins without a counselor present.
- Do not touch other people's things. If a camper is caught stealing they will be sent home.
- All campers are expected to participate in all activities.
- There will be no touching at camp (i.e. hugs, hand holding, public displays of affection, etc.) No touching in a non-therapeutic way!
- All medication needs to be checked in to the nurse. There will be designated times for taking medicine before the morning and evening devotionals.
- Campers are expected to wear their name tags above their waist at all times.
- Campers are only allowed into the cafeteria during meals and crafts times. Under no circumstances will campers be allowed in the kitchen at any time.
- Campers should stay on paved paths when possible to avoid snakes and ticks.
- No electronic devices are allowed at camp (i.e. mp3 players, tv's, portable gaming devices, etc.)
- Cell phones are NOT allowed at camp. If campers bring them they must be checked in with the nurse. Please do not bring them if they are not necessary.
- Campers are not allowed to touch the audio/visual equipment unless given permission by a counselor. This includes speakers, microphones, projectors or any other audio equipment.
- Boys are not permitted to wear ear rings at camp. No camper is allowed to have any 'body' jewelry in while they are at camp (i.e. eyebrow rings, tongue rings, etc.) Tattoos need to be covered up.
- No tank tops, spaghetti straps, halter tops, crop tops, and the belly or back may not be exposed.
- All shorts must go all the way to the camper's knees (NO EXCEPTIONS). No pants that show underwear are not allowed at camp.
- Clothing must not be too tight or clingy.
- There will be no pranks or camp/cabin initiations.
- If you drive to camp you may not leave the camp until it is time to check out.
- No camper will be allowed to swim without a notarized swimming waiver (NO EXCEPTIONS).
